



The Strawberry Mountains (seen from Logan Valley) dominate the eastern half of the Malheur Forest...



...but most of the eastern forest is a mosaic of dense ponderosas pine, wet meadows and dry sage flats.



Less-visited attractions here are the river and stream canyons, with good hiking trails...



...and Monument Rock Wilderness, an easily-accessed, high elevation ridge with scenic vistas.



The western half of the Malheur Forest is drier, with scattered stands of ponderosa pine and juniper.



However, hidden within this drier landscape are some thickly-forested stream canyons...



...with well-developed trails, streamside meadows and old growth ponderosa pines.



Above the stream canyons are open slopes with great views and, if lucky, bighorn sheep sightings.
