

**Photos of White Mountain Trail**  
Colville National Forest, Kettle Falls Ranger District

July 7, 2016



The trail starts in a wide, flat parking area off Road 250, with White Mtn. looming to the west.



As the route climbs around the hillside, the first long views are west into the Hall Creek drainage.



From Mile 1 to 2, the trail switchbacks up through fir groves, over carpets of blue lupine in July.



Above the firs are open alpine meadows, with long views back east to the Barnaby Creek watershed.





At 3.0 miles, the trail finally crests the southwest ridge, with panoramic vistas south over Buckhorn Mtn.



Over the ridge, the route leaves the main trail and climbs a faint side trail up 200' to the summit.



Approaching the White Mtn. summit, one has long views west over the Okanogan Highlands and beyond.



The summit features spirit-quest cairns and vistas east over the Columbia River valley to the Selkirk Mtns.
