300 yards from the parking area, the trail leaves the gravel road and crosses the dam below the first lake.



Just past this first lake, all trails converge into one at this double-post break in the fence line.



At 1.0 miles, the established trail ends near basalt bluffs on the east shore of a long lake.



The route follows game trails north along the elevated rim of the lake and an old channel of Crab Creek.



At 2.9 miles, one finds the marshes where the Gloyd Seeps drainage meets the old Crab Creek channel.



The route then turns southeast, following game trails on the south bank of the Gloyd Seeps drainage.



At 3.4 miles, the first big marshes of the Gloyd Seeps proper appear, with numerous waterfowl.



At 4.0 miles, one arrives at shallow, open-water seep lakes — a good bird watching and hike destination.
